SHAW FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES 2027 PLAYBILL

- First time two musicals will share the Festival Theatre stage, complemented by vibrant dramas, mysteries, Spontaneous Theatre and classic fables starting March 31 -

Niagara-on-the-Lake, ON (August 25, 2026) – The [Shaw Festival](#) announced its highly anticipated 65th season playbill today, for the first time in Shaw history featuring two musicals on the Festival Theatre stage during the main season. The vibrant lineup, beginning March 31, 2027, features a romantic Shavian drama, a stupendous Stoppard satire, Spontaneous Theatre, spooky mysteries and classic fables. In 2027, audiences will experience a compelling diversity of shows highlighting The Shaw's rich traditions of creativity and adventure while embracing the future of two-way theatre.

"Two big, beloved and wildly different musicals on the Festival Theatre stage – surrounded by murder, mayhem, Shaw, Stoppard and a few rather gruesome fairy tales – gives our artists and audiences an irresistible playground for 2027," said Tim Carroll, Artistic Director of the Shaw Festival. "With this diverse range of titles, we're also working on new ways to share these shows through our Beyond the Stage workshops and events to bring our audiences even closer to the art, their creativity and each other."

Kicking off next season is ***Arsenic and Old Lace*** by Joseph Kesselring, a classic dark comedy where family eccentricities take a murderous and hilariously chaotic turn – and Ira Levin's acclaimed comic thriller ***Deathtrap***, drawing audiences in with the promise of plot twists and a play within a play. Next, one of two musical productions this season, the beloved Broadway hit from the legendary Rodgers & Hammerstein, ***South Pacific***, sets sail at the Festival Theatre, followed by the return of Bernard Shaw's ***Arms and the Man*** – the first Shaw to play at the Court House Theatre since 2017. These four productions officially open Shaw's 2027 season from May 28 – 30, 2027.

"Our audiences have enthusiastically welcomed the return of the Court House Theatre as a Shaw venue this year, and we couldn't be more delighted to bring Bernard Shaw back to the stage where The Shaw began in 1962," said Tim Jennings, Executive Director/CEO of the Shaw Festival. "There's something very special about celebrating where we started while also looking ahead to the reopening of the Royal George Theatre in fall 2028 and an exciting new chapter for The Shaw."

The Shaw Festival's 2027 season begins March 31 and runs until December 23.

This witty satire on romantic attitudes to war, heroism and marriage remains one of Shaw's most popular comedies.
